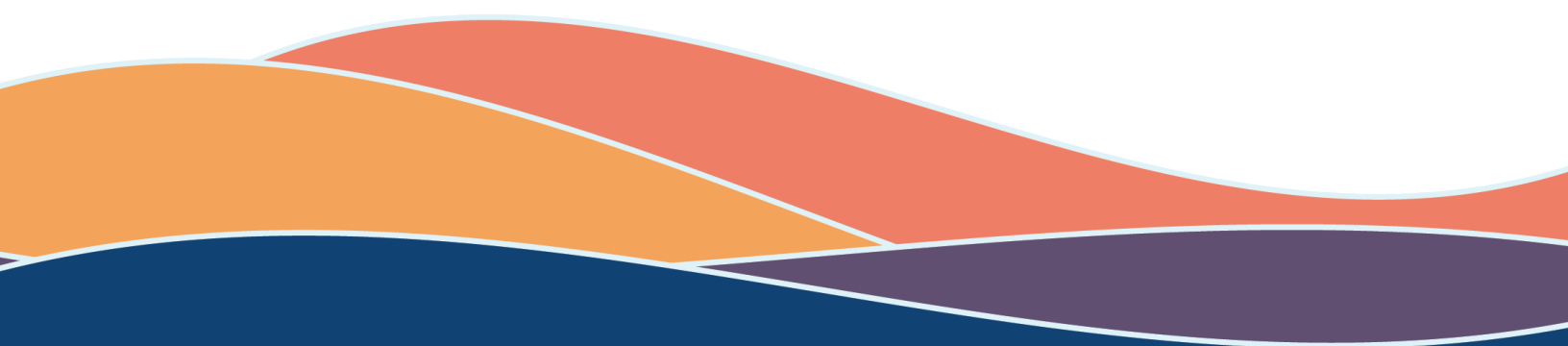
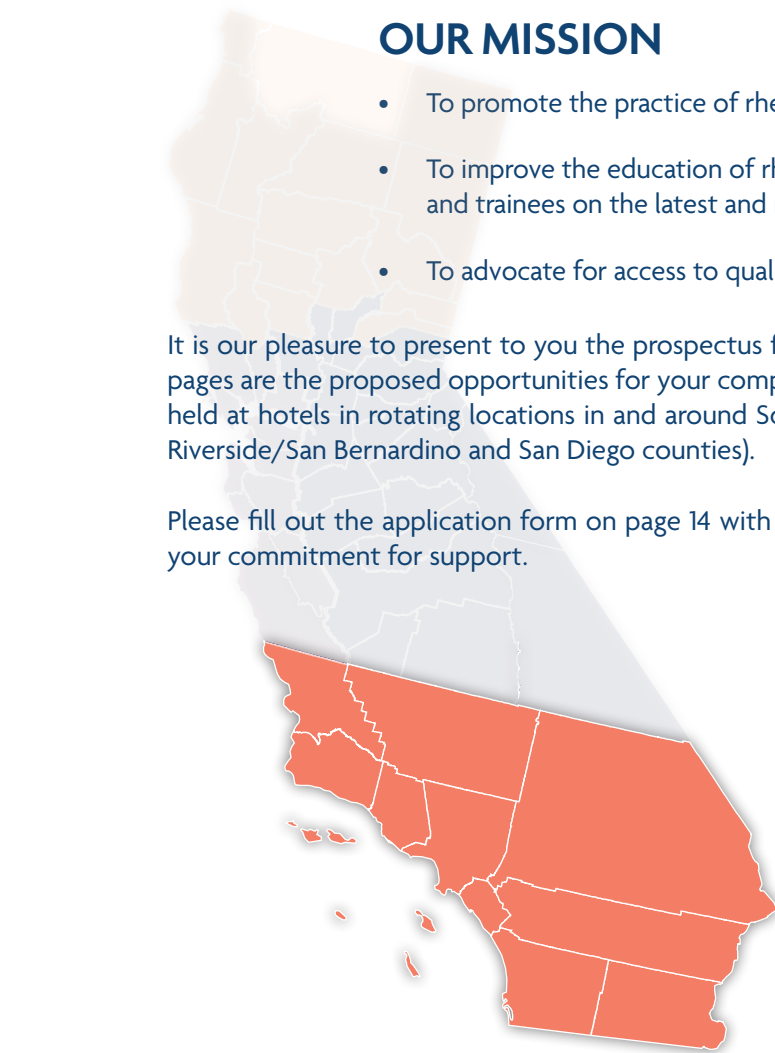
- To promote the practice of rheumatology in Southern California.

SCRS holds a membership of at least 700 rheumatologists from Southern California. We have also engaged with academic programs within Southern California to provide training in rheumatologic ultrasound, venues for fellows to enjoy camaraderie across programs, and forums for discussion related to career advancement. We are managed by the Suwanee River Area Health Education Center (SRAHEC), led by Sarah Catalanotto as its Executive Director and Laura Moore as its Manager. SRAHEC also manages the Ultrasound School of North American Rheumatologists (USSONAR).



ACTIVITIES

Over the past several years, we have held meetings every 1-3 months with agenda that include content related to scientific advances, updates on advocacy and practice support, and issues related to professional development, and personal wellness. During COVID, we adapted by launching the Teach the Teacher Professional Development Series which featured 10 talks by rheumatologists versed in education, leadership and faculty development.

In 2022, SCRS started a yearly MSK-Rheum ultrasound course for all rheumatology fellows in Southern California. For 2024, we held highly attended symposiums about lupus and Sjogren's and presented lifetime achievement awards to Dr. Bevra H. Hahn and Dr. Orrin M. Troum.

In preparation for 2026, we present to you an opportunity to engage with SCRS and its programs. We will be holding at least 4 quarterly meetings in the next year.

FELLOWS' TRAINING PROGRAM

SCRS strives to engage rheumatology fellows in Southern California and support their education. One of our primary efforts is our annual two-day musculoskeletal ultrasound course. This has helped augment the number of rheumatologists trained in musculoskeletal ultrasound given the limited capacity of available training programs. The inaugural program was in 2022 and has grown significantly in capacity and scope annually given high demand and enthusiasm by both rheumatology fellows and program directors. Our disease specific symposiums (such as Lupus, Sjogren's, Myositis, Scleroderma) were also well-attended by fellows and residents and were an excellent opportunity to learn the newest developments in these fields from true experts.

At SCRS, we also believe that the education of future rheumatologists extends beyond the teaching of medical science. We have also held career fairs and invited local rheumatologists to discuss different practice settings: academic, private practice, and industry. Topics have further included contract review as well as the changing landscape of Southern California for rheumatology practices.
